4. They Did It - A Second Time!

A raffle fundraiser was held in March to raise funds for a water filtration system. The fundraiser was a tremendous success and the students were able to raise a total of \$4565.88. The water filtration system was installed on March 22, 2015 (World Water Day) at the Sambhota Tibetan School, Dekyiling, Uttarakhand State, India. The water filtration system will benefit the 179 students and 30 staff members at the school. This system will enable the school community to maintain a high level of

general health and protect them from various waterborne illnesses including typhoid and cholera. Having surpassed their fundraising goal which was \$2500 the sixth graders voted on donating the remaining funds to two additional charities which are "Kids for Kids" in Darfur that helps children living in abject poverty and "Family House" in San Francisco that helps families of children living with cancer.

Well here I am...Now numbered among the corps of cancer survivors, I have one kidney left to my name. The other one was sacrificed so as to be rid of a rapidly growing carcinoma characterized as a stage 3 (most aggressive form of kidney cancer).

Together with some post-operative internal bleeding, it all proved to be a very interesting experience indeed. I want to thank so many of you for the get well cards, remembrances in prayer, and other messages and offers of help. I am immensely grateful.

Touching as well were the homemade get well cards from the almost 500 students of St. Gabriel School. They have been kind enough to assure me of their prayers, and the fact that I have been missed. Many expressed their eagerness to once again have me offer the Eucharist and one young man said he misses my preaching --- during which he hardly ever falls asleep!

I have experienced the graciousness of people who have ministered to me...,"In a Pinch", an organization that steps up to help people on short notice with a home cooked meal, delivered each day to my door until I was able to get out on my own...my sister Sharon who came to stay with me for 5 weeks...friends and parishioners who have shopped for me and transported me to appointments and procedures.

I thank all of you!

God's grace is evident in our lives in many ways, and while much of this has been difficult for me...it has also been a time when compassion and hope abounded. And for this, I am gratefull



Families who do not perform the required parent participation will be placed the following school year in tuition Plan B if they are eligible for the Parish
