SHIELD THE VULNERABLE REMINDER

Anyone having access to our children, whether chaperoning field trips, volunteering in the Classroom, room parents, library volunteers, yard duty, hot lunch or volunteering for our various fundraisers <u>MUST</u> complete both the online training and background check through Shield the Vulnerable. <u>THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. To complete the online training and background check, please visit the website <u>www.shieldthevulnerable.org</u>. When it asks for your affiliation, please list yourself as an elementary school <u>volunteer NOT parent</u>. If you are unable to file the background check electronically, download the form, complete it, and bring it to the office with your ID. Mrs. Demartini will then take care of the processing. Online training and Background Checks must be renewed every three (3) years.

The Archdiocese of San Francisco has asked that each school be at or above 95% compliant by June of this year. Some parents have already been notified that their online training and/or background checks have expired. Those parents not responding to the notification in a timely manner will be put on "inactive" and unable to do volunteer work. 


