To those of you who are new to this event the Academic Decathlon is a competition consisting of three parts: (1) individual subjects, (2) a logic quiz, and (3) a super quiz. The last two are collaborative team efforts. The logic quiz has 20 rigorous math and logic puzzles, spatial or geometric visualizations and word math. The super quiz is composed of 50 questions on five broad academic themes.

The team then writes what it considers significant accomplishments and critical goals based on the report, their interviews and their observations. This final report is shared with the staff of the school being evaluated.

STUDENTS ASSISTANCE

On Saturday, January 31, 2015, 6A and 6B students participated in the Pine Lake Restoration Program for the first time. Dylan Hayes, the Natural Areas gardener at Pine Lake gave the students a very thorough and interesting introduction to the floral and fauna biodiversity present at Pine Lake. The students saw dabbling, skimming, and diving ducks, a Great Blue Heron camouflaged in the Tule patch, and tasted lemony Oxalis (Wood Sorrel).Lastly, the students watered the 22 Blue Elderberry trees that 7A and 7B planted on October 29, 2014. These Blue Elderberry trees curtail soil erosion on the south side slope and serve as an excellent food source for butterflies and native and migrating birds. Everyone enjoyed the morning!

In October, letters were mailed home to all families with students entering seventh grade in the fall of 2015, regarding the California Department of Public Health requirement for the Tdap (pertussis booster). This booster is required for all students entering seventh grade.

So far only 15 out of 56 sixth grade students have responded. This is a serious matter and students will not have their name placed on the seventh grade class list without this booster.


