TESTING FOR GRADES 2-8

All Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of San Francisco will administer the "IOWA Assessment Tests". Testing will start on September 18th and will continue through September 26th.

The results of your student's test will be shared with you during Parent/Teacher Conferences in November. The results of these Assessments are important for teacher understanding of student skills and for future planning. Please do not schedule appointments during testing days.

COMING TO YOU SOON

New Parent Handbooks will be sent home to each family by mid-October. There are always additions and adjustments to the Handbook. Please read it over, share the contents with your student(s) and sign and return the Contract.

COMING TO YOU BY OCTOBER

During the month of September, all families receive the yearly "Parent Notification" for Asbestos Information. Please contact Milena Tapia if you do not receive yours by the last week of September.

NOT SAFE IDEAS VS. SAFE IDEAS

Parents - If your student is scheduled to attend Extended Care after school you may want to have a reminder conversation. All students, kindergarten through eighth grade are to go immediately to extended care to be checked in and not find their way to Walgreens or South Sunset Park before checking in at EC.

If you usually pick up your son or daughter right after school and find that you will be late, call school to let us know, before school is out, and we'll send your child to extended care. This is a safe environment.

GENERAL PARENT MEETING - SEPTEMBER 30, 2014 - HOLD THIS DATE

The General Parent Meeting for the beginning of school will be held on Tuesday, September 30, 2014. Refreshments and a chance for socializing will be available between 6:45 - 7:00PM in Bedford Hall. Mark this date on your calendar. You will receive an agenda soon. This is a <u>MANDATORY</u> meeting, at lease one parent must attend.

EGG DROP - SEPTEMBER 29th - 12 NOON

Each year students in grades 6-8 participate in our annual "Egg Drop". They design a container that protects a raw egg. The egg is dropped from a height of seven meters.

In 7th grade science, students study the laws of motion. As objects fall, they accelerate due to the force of gravity. The 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students have been encouraged to be creative in choosing material to cushion the impact.

We will keep records of the mass of the winning entries. The container that protects the Egg and has the least mass is the winner.

REMINDERS ON THE USE OF AUTOMOBILES FOR FIELD TRIPS

Each year we are asked to post these reminders.

- 1. Drivers should be between 25 and 65.
- 2. Drivers must have a valid, unrestricted drivers license and a "clean" driving record for the past three years: no fault accidents, no tickets for speeding, reckless driving, driving under the influence, etc. A copy of each driver's license must be kept on file.
- 3. A driver should carry liability insurance on the vehicle to be used.
 - a. \$500,000 is required for employees or volunteers who <u>frequently</u> drive their own vehicles.
 - b. \$300,000 is the expected norm.
 - c. \$100,000 is an absolutely required minimum.
- 4. Children risk injury if they are unbelted, improperly belted or otherwise too close to the dashboard when an air bag inflates. To assure safety, always buckle children in the back seat. If the vehicle does not have a back seat, move the front seat as far back as possible from the dashboard.
- 5. One seat belt must be provided for and used by each vehicle occupant.
- 6. According to California State Law, children must be buckled into booster seats in vehicles until they turn eight (8) or grow to a height of 4 feet 9 inches.
- 7. No private (non-chartered) vehicle, including vans, with more than nine seats should be used. Additionally, no one may ride in the bed of a pick-up truck.
- 8. A driver's route may not be deviated from the intended destination going or returning. A driver <u>MAY NOT</u> stop his/her car to "treat" students to lunch, snacks, etc. Since such an act would not be listed on the original Teacher Field Trip Permission Form, it would not be covered by school insurance.
- 9. <u>ALL</u> drivers must have completed the Shield the Vulnerable online training and background check before being eligible to drive on a field trip.

SHIELD THE VULNERABLE REMINDER

To complete the online training and background check requirements, please visit the website <u>www.shieldthevulnerable.org</u>. When it asks for your affiliation, please list yourself as an elementary school volunteer. If you are unable to file the background check form electronically, download the form, complete it, and bring it to the office with your ID. Mrs. Demartini will then take care of the processing.

Once you have completed your online training, please send a copy of your certificate of completion to Barbara Demartini in the school office.

CLINIC UPDATES

Just a few notes for parents that may help with necessary paperwork during the school year.

Emergency Information: This is very IMPORTANT!

You received your child's emergency information page the first day of school. This information is very important. Whenever you have a change in home/work information or emergency contacts, please send a note with your signature to the clinic as soon as possible. If your child is ill or injured we need to reach you as soon as possible. It does help when we have your most current information.

Illness:

When your child is sick please call the first day and then every other day. Your child should bring a note from his/her parent the day he/she returns to school explaining why they were absent. (Even for half-day absences!)

I am not able to accept emails for illnesses so please call on the first day of the absence. (If the illness continues, please call every other day) If you have a planned absence (personal reasons, etc..), please send in a written notice prior to leaving.

Notes you send to School:

When sending in any written communication to the school, please be sure to include the following information: Your <u>student's</u> full name, grade (i.e. 5A), and parent's signature. (Please remember this on all notes)

Appointments/Early Dismissals: .

If your child has an appointment during class time, a note should be sent the day before explaining the reason for leaving during the school day. Anytime your child leaves school you must get an excuse note from the doctor/dentist's office. This note must be given to the Clinic when the child returns to school. The offices usually have preprinted forms available. When students return to school they must check back into the Clinic with their doctor's note.

All student's must be picked up from the Clinic when leaving for appointments or personal reasons during the school day. An adult (18 years or older) must pick up the student from the Clinic and sign them out. Anyone picking up a student, other than a parent, must be listed on the student's emergency form.

Tardiness:

A student is considered tardy if he/she does not enter class with classmates.

When students are tardy, they must come into the Clinic to get a tardy slip. This slip should be signed by the parent and returned to school the next day. For attendance to run smoothly, the Clinic must know when students are tardy.

Prescription and/or Non-Prescription Medications:

When your child has to take any medication (prescription or non-prescription) during the school day, we must have a St. Gabriel Physician's Statement signed by the doctor and the parent. This form is attached to this bulletin and extra forms are available in the Clinic. No medications can be given to students without completion of this specific form.

Medications listed on the Physician Statement can be kept in the Clinic so that the student can take them when necessary. Please contact Janet Barry in the Clinic at 415-566-0314 if you have any questions about this matter.

Homework on sick days:

In order for the teachers to organize all your child's work please request the homework in the morning by 10am. Homework will be left at the office counter to be picked up before 3:30pm, or it can be sent home through another student.

SCRIP for Sale!

Scrip can be purchased in the Clinic each school day. Scrip hours are:

8:15am to 11:00am (everyday)

1:00pm to 3:15pm (everyday)

Minimum Days (8:15am to 12:45pm) 12:30pm dismissal

Early Dismissal Days (8:15am to 2:45pm) 2:30pm dismissal

If you see me wandering along the hallway, ask me about buying scrip and I'll do my best to help you. I would like to thank all the parents who do purchase scrip from the Clinic - you are all very patient!

Reminder: The new Scrip program begins this school year. The program requirement is no longer a flat amount of \$2500.00, each family is now required to earn \$150.00 in profit for St Gabriel's. Please take notice of the percentage each retailer gives back to St Gabriel's when making your purchases. Please go to http://www.sgsparents.com/events/d_scrip to learn more about the Scrip opportunities and to see what is available and the percentages they give back to St Gabriel's.

Please remember that only a small subset of retailers are kept in the clinic for purchasing, for a full list please visit http://www.glscrip.com This is called a "special order". Orders received by Janet by Thursday will be sent home the following Thursday. Let us know a week ahead of time if you plan to make a large purchase of the scrip kept in the clinic and we will be sure to have enough for you.

Reports will be sent home to families to monitor the percentage they have earned for St Gabriel so you do not have to keep track yourself, however make sure to send in your Lucky receipts or E-Scrip reports early on so you have a sense of where you are and aren't rushing in the end to make your \$150.00 goal.



A Note from the Counselors

Talking to your children about behavior-

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Another School year has begun, and we are excited to see how all the students have grown! With each new year, we have a fresh opportunity to teach children valuable lessons. It is our hope that students will thrive academically but will also grow socially, emotionally, and spiritually. We find that growth in these areas is fostered by experience at school, with peers, and most importantly, with you.

As you may remember, St. Gabriel school instituted a school wide Unacceptable Behavior Policy in 2008. Each year we continue to refine our policy to support the students and to best meet the needs of the school.

Since the involvement of parents and guardians is so critical to the success of helping children grow and in achieving their goals, we would like to take the opportunity to provide you with tools you can use with your children at home to discuss behavior.

Current research suggests that children who have very clear rules at home, who have consistent consequences for their actions, and whose parents spend quality time with them and show love and affection are resilient, successful, and confident. Discipline is most effective when viewed as an opportunity to teach. It is important to talk to your children about their behavior so they can learn from their mistakes and make better decisions in the future. Acknowledging your child for positive behavior is just as important as teaching them how to correct a negative behavior. The next time you see your child do something positive, acknowledge what your child did and why you think it was helpful or positive. It is important to your child's self esteem to receive recognition and to be encouraged to make good decisions.

Emotional growth in your children can be readily achieved when both parenting and school approaches to behavior are as consistent as possible. When your child has a conflict at school or at home, you may consider discussing the following with your child in conjunction with applying a consequence (this approach is currently used at St. Gabriel School):

- 1) Describe what happened
- 2) What were you thinking before you acted the way you did?
- 3) What did you do wrong?
- 4) How do you feel about what happened?
- 5) How do you think the other person feels?
- 6) Brainstorm possible solutions to the problem
- 7) What could you do differently next time?

You can also help your children resolve conflicts at home or at school by following these steps(The Bully Free Classroom):

- 1) Relax-Take time to calm down and figure out what you are feeling.
- 2) Choose to solve the problem-Let the other person know that you are ready to talk about the problem
- 3) Share your feelings-Be honest and use "I statements" when talking about the problem (Example-"I feel like you didn't include me today at recess" instead of "You never want to play with me.")
- 4) Listen- Listen to the other person's side without interrupting. You can also ask questions to understand the other person's point of view after he or she is done talking.
- 5) Find a solution-Brainstorm possible solutions, agree on a solution, and then test out the plan. If the solution you tried does not work try another plan.
- 6) Make a plan for the future- Talk about better ways to handle the situation in the future before it becomes a problem.

Our goal is to continue to make St. Gabriel School a supportive environment for your children to grow and learn. St. Gabriel's Scrip Program

Q. What is Scrip?

A. Scrip is not only a fundraiser, but it is an integral part of our operating budget. The revenue from Scrip is based on a percentage from each retailer.

Q. How will the Scrip program change?

A. Up through the 2013-'14 school year, each participating family was required to purchase \$2500 via Scrip, E-Scrip, or Lucky Shares.

Beginning July 1, 2014, each family will need to generate a certain amount of profit (\$150 of profit per family).

Q. How will each family reach the goal of \$150.00 of profit?

A. Being aware of the percentages of profit received from each retailer will help families attain the goal.

For example,

If you purchase \$300 of Classic Design (10% profit), St. Gabriel's receives \$30.00. If you purchase \$300 of Chevron (1% profit), St. Gabriel's receives \$3.00.

Q. How do I know the percentages offered by the retailers?

A. Go to the Great Lakes website www.glscrip.com
There is a listing of participating retailers and their corresponding percentages.
There is also information about the retailers' scrip cards that you can order through our Special Orders.

Q. How will each family keep track of their profit?

A. Nothing will change in the way you purchase or order Scrip.
In the first year of this profit-based program, you will receive bi-monthly reports, starting in October 2014, that state the percentage of profit for each of your Scrip purchases.

Q. How will E-Scrip & Lucky Shares work in a percentage-based program?

A. All E-Scrip purchases count as 3%, and Lucky Shares are 2%.

**FYI – When you purchase Safeway Scrip cards (3%) and then use them at the store with your E-Scrip program (4%), the school receives 7% profit.

With Lucky, you get 2% for Scrip card purchases and 2% for Lucky Shares (4% profit).

Volunteer work is part of our commitment as parents and guardians of children at St. Gabriel School. Our participation enhances the quality and the affordability of our children's education.

Two-parent families are required to perform 40 hours of parent participation between July and June. Single-parent families are required to perform 20 hours of parent participation between July and June.

Because of Archdiocesan policy, families may not "pay off" their required hours. However, if families purchase materials for the school, they will be credited with one parent hour for each \$15 worth of materials purchased.

Families who do not perform the required parent participation will be placed the following school year in tuition Plan B if they are eligible for the Parish subsidy or in tuition Plan D if they are not eligible for the Parish subsidy.

What activities count toward parent hours? Classroom and school-wide volunteer activities, such as:

Parent Organization Events Chaperoning field trips Snack bar

Room Parent sewing costumes coaching

Attendance at mandatory school meetings, school events or athletic games does not count toward parent hours! Remember, buying scrip does not count toward your parent hours.

You may use the form on the reverse to report your 2014-2015 parent participation hours. Your hours are not recorded anywhere else, so don't forget to note them down after each activity! Don't stop counting at 20 or 40 hours. It's important for fund raising purposes that we know all the volunteer hours you have contributed. Return the form to us at the end of the school year. We have a mailbox in the clinic. If you prefer to keep your own database of hours instead of using this form, please be sure to note each of your children and their grade level. Forms are due by May 8th for Eighth Grade families, and May 22ND for all other families.
