Testing for Grades 2-8

All Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of San Francisco will administer the STAR Assessments in Reading and Math . The baseline testing window begins on September 6th and will continue through September 26th. The results of these tests will be shared with you during Parent-Teacher Conferences in November. The teachers will also review the results as a checkpoint for your child's learning, future planning of instruction and curriculum. Please see the attached letter from Dr. Nina Russo, Superintendent of Schools, regarding this new form of standardized testing.

Helpful tips for starting the new school year:

With the beginning of a new school year, comes new routines and new challenges. Thank you to our resource team for bringing us some helpful parent tips on starting off this school year on the right foot. From Challenge Success:

CHALLENGE SUCCESS

Top Ten Back-to-School Tips to Help your Child Thrive in School This Year

1. Ask your child: "How was your day? Learn anything interesting? Get to spend time with friends?" instead of "How did you do on the math test?"
2. Resist the urge to correct the errors in your child's homework. It's your child's work, not yours.
3. Work done with integrity is more important than an A. Pressure to achieve *only* high grades can make students resort to cheating.
4. Make time for P.D.F.: playtime, downtime, family time. Research shows P.D.F. is critical for overall well-being.
5. Create a technology-free environment during mealtimes. Every adult and child can benefit from a break from constant interruptions and distractions.
6. Collaborate with your child's teachers. Assume best intentions and work together to solve problems.
7. Fight the temptation to bring your child's forgotten homework to school. Kids gain resilience by learning from small failures.
8. An extra hour of sleep is more valuable than an extra hour of studying. Research shows sleep deprivation can be associated with depression and anxiety.
9. When your child wants to talk with you, stop what you are doing and engage. Does "I hate school" really mean something else: "I am being bullied" or "I don't fit in?"
10. Help your child develop his or her interests and strengths. Discover what your child really loves to do outside of school, not what you think a college admissions officer would like to see on an application.

Reminders on Being Good Neighbors and being SAFE when Parking

Please remember that St. Gabriel School and Parish have neighbors. We need to practice being good neighbors, as Jesus asks us, when parking in the area. Double parking and leaving your vehicle is not allowed. Also, keep out of driveways when parking--take a look to make sure there is no blockage before you leave your car. Our neighbors need to move about during the day. For safety reasons, their driveways need to be kept clear and the traffic outside their homes needs to keep moving. All of these things will keep everyone SAFE! Thank you for keeping these parking rules in mind.

Reminders on the use of Automobiles for Field Trips

Each year we are asked to post these reminders:

1. Drivers should be between **25 and 65 years of age**.
2. Drivers must have a valid, unrestricted driver's license and a "clean" driving record for the past 3 years: no fault accidents, no tickets for speeding, reckless driving, driving under the influence, etc. **A copy of each driver's license must be kept on file.**
3. A driver should carry liability insurance on the vehicle to be used.
 - a. \$500,000 is required for employees or volunteers who frequently drive their own vehicles.
 - b. \$300,000 is the expected norm.

- c. \$100,000 is the absolute minimum.
4. Children risk injury if they are unbelted, improperly belted or otherwise too close to the dashboard when an airbag inflates. To assure safety, always buckle children in the back seat. If the vehicle does not have a back seat, move the front seat as far back as possible from the dashboard.
5. **One seat belt must be provided for and used by each vehicle occupant.**
6. According to California State Law, children must be buckled into booster seats in vehicles until they turn eight (8) years old or grow to a height of 4 feet 9 inches.
7. **No private (non-chartered) vehicle, including vans with more than 9 seats should be used.** Additionally, no one may ride in the back of a pickup truck.
8. **A driver's route may not be deviated from the intended destination - going or returning. A driver MAY NOT stop his/her car to "treat" students to lunch, snack, etc.** Since such an act would not be listed on the original Teacher Field Trip Permission Slip, it would not be covered by school insurance.
9. **ALL drivers must have completed the Shield the Vulnerable online training and background check before being eligible to drive on a field trip.**

If you or someone you know is interested in becoming Catholic; or if you or someone you know has been baptized but has not yet been confirmed or received First Communion, please call Matt Shea at 415-731-6161 and leave the name and phone number of the person so that he may make contact and let them know a little bit more about the process.

Or you may be the person who would like to learn more, you may want to be able to understand and share the faith that your children are learning here at school. CLINIC UPDATES

Just a few notes for parents that may help with necessary paperwork during the school year.

Emergency Information: **This is very IMPORTANT!**

You will have received your child's emergency information page the first day of school. This information is very important. Whenever you have a change in home/work information or emergency contacts, please send a note with your signature to the clinic as soon as possible. If your child is ill or injured, we need to reach you as soon as possible. It does help when we have your most current information.

Illness:

When your child is sick, please call the first day and then every other day. Your child should bring a note from his/her parent the day he/she returns to school explaining why they were absent. (Even for half-day absences!)

I am not able to accept emails for illnesses so please call on the first day of the absence. (If the illness continues, please call every other day.) If you have a planned absence (personal reasons, etc.), please send in a written notice prior to leaving.

Notes you send to School:

When sending in any written communication to the school, please be sure to include the following information: Your **child's** full name, grade (e.g., 5A), and parent's signature. (Please remember this on your typewritten notes.)

Appointments/Early Dismissals:

If your child has an appointment during class time, a note should be sent the day before explaining the reason for leaving during the school day. Anytime your child leaves school, you must get an excuse note from the doctor/dentist's office. This note must be given to the Clinic when the child returns to school. The offices usually have preprinted forms available. If they return to school, they must check back into the Clinic with their doctor's note.

All students must be picked up from the Clinic when leaving for appointments or personal reasons during the school day. An adult (18 years or older) must pick up the student from the Clinic and sign them out. Anyone picking up a student, other than a parent, must be listed on the student's emergency form.

Tardiness:

A student is considered tardy if he/she does not enter class with classmates.

When students are tardy, **they must come into the Clinic to get a tardy slip**. This slip should be signed by the parent and returned to school the next day. For attendance to run smoothly, the Clinic must know when students are tardy.

Prescription and/or Non-Prescription Medications:

When your child has to take any medication (prescription or non-prescription) during the school day, **we must have** a St. Gabriel Physician's Statement signed by the doctor and the parent. This form is attached to this bulletin and extra forms are available in the Clinic. **No medications can be given to students without completion of this specific form.** Medications listed on the Physician Statement can be kept in the Clinic so that the student can take them when necessary. **A new physician statement is needed each year.** Please contact Janet Barry in the Clinic at 415-566-0314 if you have any questions about this matter.

Homework on sick days:

In order for the teachers to organize all your child's work, please request homework in the morning by 10am. Homework will be left at the office counter to be picked up before 3:30pm, or it can be sent home through another student.

Dear Parents,

Over the next three weeks your child, along with all 2nd through 8th grade students in the Archdiocese of San Francisco, will take the Renaissance STAR Reading and STAR Math Assessments. This new assessment system will replace the IOWA test that was previously given each fall. The decision to move from IOWA to STAR was reached through a process of extensive research, including the review of best practices for student assessment that provides information regarding students' strengths and target specific areas for academic growth.

Renaissance STAR Assessments are computer-adaptive tests that continually adjust the difficulty of each child's test by choosing each test question based on the child's previous response. If the child misses a question, the difficulty is decreased. Computer-adaptive tests save testing time and spare your child the frustration of items that are too difficult and the boredom of items that are too easy. On average, students will complete the STAR Math test in about 40 minutes and the STAR Reading test in about 30 minutes.

STAR offers educators a variety of scores and reports. Some STAR scores compare your child's performance to a specific criteria or to a standard (criterion-referenced scores). STAR reports also include scores which compare your child's performance to other students who have taken the same test (norm-referenced scores) across the nation in a percentile metric.

Assessments will be used to monitor student growth throughout the year, to estimate students' understanding of the Common Core standards, and help teachers determine appropriate instruction levels and skills that students are ready to learn. In order to collect this longitudinal data, all students in the Archdiocese will be given three STAR assessments at universal screening dates: September 6 – September 27, January 9 – January 20, and May 8 – May 19.

We are extremely excited about this transition to the STAR Assessments and we are confident that you will be as well as you engage with your child's teacher and principal in examining the data.
